

CMN Institutional Aid Guidelines

The CARES Act provides short term financial need to students due to the COVID-19 Pandemic that if otherwise not addressed could prevent the student from persisting or graduation. This assistance was created to help students recover from the unforeseen expenses related to the disruption on campus operations due to the coronavirus.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY:

- A student must be a United States Citizen or an eligible Non-Citizen (*i.e. an eligible social security number*).
- A student must be accepted for the 2021 Spring semester.
- A student must be registered in a Degree Program for the 2021 Spring semester.
- A student may only receive one emergency grant during the 2021 Spring semester.

STUDENT AID AMOUNTS

- Full-Time: 12+ \$520.00
- Quarter-Time: 9-11 \$425.00
- Half-Time: 6-8 \$375.00
- Part-Time: 5 or Less \$200.00

APPLICATION PROCESS

Students will need to fill out an application [online](#) or paper form and to submit to demadosh@menominee.edu.

NEXT STEPS

The CARES Act Committee will review all applications and students will be notified by e-mail of the decision. If approved for funding payments will be made payable to students directly. Payment type will be determined by the College on a case-by-case basis.
