What is the Protective Factors Training?

The Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Board coordinates the Bringing the Protective Factors Framework to Life in Your Work initiative throughout Wisconsin. The training is designed to re-energize family service providers, enhance their efforts to partner with parents and see families from a more positive, strengths-based perspective. The curriculum was developed by the National Alliance of Children's Trust and prevention Funds.



The Strengthening Families Protective Factors Framework is an approach that helps organizations or individuals work in partnership with families to identify their needs and utilize existing assets to prevent child abuse and neglect and support the healthy development of children.

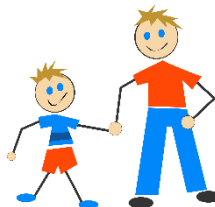
(5) Protective Factors Framework
