Scope & Content: Steve and Patricia Raymer visited the Menominee Indian Reservation (then Menominee County) during the summer of 1974 for a story for *National Geographic* magazine. Sanome and Merceline Sanapaw, and their family, hosted the Raymers, introducing them to traditional foods and life ways. While the article discusses the negative effects of Termination on Menominee people, it also highlights efforts to preserve traditional Menominee culture and values, and the work to restore the Menominee to federally-recognized tribal status.

The collection contains black and white prints of photographs featured in the *National Geographic* article, along with two copies of the magazine the article appeared in, and a letter Raymer sent to Ada Deer.
